Addiction Medicine at BrightView

The BrightView program is designed as a comprehensive medical wellness model. Our curriculum guides and educates patients on how to build the foundation for a life-long recovery process; educating patients on the neuropsychological approach. Our program includes a comprehensive treatment plan for symptom management, medical and psychological stabilization, and parallels the early phases of recovery.

Although medication assisted treatment is an important part of the model at BrightView, pharmacotherapy alone is rarely sufficient treatment for substance use disorder. Treatment outcomes demonstrate a dose-response effect based on the level or amount of psychosocial treatment services that are provided. Therefore, we at BrightView believe that we have an additional level of responsibility to patients with substance use disorder; this responsibility goes beyond prescribing and/or administering medications to treat chemical dependency. In line with that philosophy, BrightView only provides medication assisted treatment services to patients who are enrolled in our mental and social wellness program.
